

The Show

Ajolähtö - Kickstart is a show based on a road trip that goes wrong. Six friends become stranded in the middle of nowhere, confronted by the unpredictable Nordic Summer.

The show explores not only the struggles of being stranded in the woods in summer, but also its beauties. Even while struggling to build a tent, being attacked by mosquitoes or failing to hitch a ride the characters take their time to enjoy the moments of bliss and as well as awkwardness they find themselves in.

Ajolähtö - Kickstart takes many inspirations from Finnish peculiarities as well as its culture. For instance the banquine dance is inspired by traditional dances and the hand-to-hand act is inspired by the tradition of Lavatanssi (a Finnish social dance) and the clumsy social interactions of Finns when they take a romantic interest in each other.

The world of the show is filled with absurd and surprising skits and farces which are brought to life by the magical realism of circus. We acknowledge the ridiculousness of the situations present, yet continue to play along with them, creating an immersive experience which then feels that much more plausible to the audience.

In the end, Ajolähtö - Kickstart is a full on circus show. The performance is held together by the circus disciplines used in each scene. Each discipline and its style of movement reflect the theme of its scene, creating a strong technical piece that carries the thread of the show from one moment to another.

The show is a personal endeavour as we have created the characters as somewhat exaggerated versions of our true selves making our reactions more realistic and relatable to the audience.

Technical Sheet







Winch. We have our own Winch but a way to fasten it to the floor is needed. A large strong column we can strap it to or a 1000kg WLL rated floor rigging point is sufficient. The only requirement is that it should be preferably in the corner of the space or at least not in the middle, best would be offstage.

Montage:

3-5 Hours (Location dependent)

Demontage:

1-2 Hours

Height requirement:

At least 7m from the floor to the roof across the horizontal centre-line of the stage

- *The diagram is an example of a best case scenario; we are more than capable of working with any regular space.
- ** For an outside venue we have trusses for aerial rigging points, stakes to create floor attachement points and can arrange the audience in a round 'traditional circus' style if possible.
- ***We do not require a sound technician as we will handle our music ourselves.




Orfeo Llewellyn:

As an artist his priority is the bigger picture and creating enjoyable moments on stage. If the artists enjoy themselves on stage the audience will reciprocate that enjoyment. He is always happy to go the extra mile to create something the public can enjoy and get lost in.





Linnea Purontaus:


Linnea is a former gymnast who found herself enjoying circus at the age of 15. She started to educate herself in Circus Gymnasiet i Gävle in Sweden and later went to Lahti circus school (Sasak). Her main discipline is tight-wire but she is interested in all forms of acrobatics as well as being thrown in the air by other people. She thinks it's important to experiment with different styles of movement and constantly trying to find ways to make the movement look more elegant and unique.

Armas Lintusaari:

Armas Lintusaari started practising circus at the age of 20 after years of trying to find his own way of artistic self expression. In circus, Armas was thrilled by its physicality, togetherness and inspiring, risk-taking artists. Armas spent his time in SaSak trying to discover the (cyr) wheel again but afterwards he has broadened his know-how to basing in double-facing cradle, banquine and some pair acrobatics.

Armas comes alive when working in a team, and being the person in the group who enjoys writing formal texts, he naturally plays the role of grantapplier in Arctic Ensemble. He likes to think of himself as a wannabe producer.

When it comes to circus and arts in general Armas is omnivorous. He's dream is to tour the world in his own tent with a kickass group show where music is live and people fly high.



Minna Pulsa:

Minna started circus as a hobby when she was 9 years old. She had dreamed of being able to fly since early childhood, just like so many other children. However the dream stuck with her and she found her way of flying through the circus. The dream grew into ever growing curiosity into the things the human body can do and finding out her own potential.

She highly enjoys working in a group. Throughout her childhood, adolescence and adulthood she had found the circus community to be one of the most valuable things in her life. Working only as a solo artist has never been her dream as it is a great team that makes working on any project so special. As an artist she always tries to give 100%, as she thinks that if you can't do something full-on it might not be worth doing at all. This is equally a strength and a weakness of hers. She also strives to be someone her team can rely on anytime and anyplace and of course have fun and enjoy all the experiences that come her way.





Anselmi Kaisanlahti:

Anselmi is a 24-year-old circus artist born in the big city of Alavus, Finland. He has a long history of circus and sports hobbies of all sorts. Besides being a kick-ass acrobat he is also a professional carpenter. On stage he is mostly seen throwing other people (and sometimes himself) around. During his career he has done over 800 performances around the world. What interests him most about circus is the diversity and the unique contact between the performers and the audience.

He is constantly coming up with new ideas and when he gets excited about something it stays on his mind 24/7. When it comes to something boring like office work it might take him a while.

Ada Forsberg:

Ada started circus at the age of 9. Since the beginning she has loved flying in different ways; hand to hand, banquine, Korean cradle, Icarian, double trapeze and so on. As long as the discipline includes the words "air" or "fly" it's her thing. She has done all sorts of aerial acrobatics, specialising in washington trapeze. (balancing herself, on her head, on top of a trapeze that probably weighs more than she does which yes, looks freaking funny when she is carrying it around.)

Give her any disclipline and she will do it... As long as it doesn't include juggling.
